### Health, Sanitation & Hygiene

Advocate and facilitate for personal and community hygiene, Sanitation and hygiene to everyone in need. It is also much important to reduce the maternal and child mortality rate and malnutrition among mother and child.

- In school of rural area we made aware student and community about importance of hand washing. During this Covid-19 period we distributed soap in 20 Govt. schools in rural areas of Gumla and Ranchi district.

- On 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2021 at Dhurwa Ranchi 300 girls were made aware on the importance of menstruation cycle and importance hygiene during this period. The use of Sanitary napkin and importance were discussed Sanitary napkin were distributed among the 48 adolescence girls of the school.

- On 16<sup>th</sup> Dec. 2021 we organized a painting competition among tribal student of rural school of Bishunpur block. The topic was Prakritik Drishya & Swachh block – Harit block ewam Swachh Bharat. The children were divided into two groups – i) Class III to V ii) Class VI to VIII. The prize distribution was done among the winner of the programme.



- On 9<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2021 A charcha was held among the newly born babies mother on importance of their personal hygiene and caring of baby. Sanitary napkin was distributed among 67 lactating mother in their “Maai Chawwa kit”. It was supported by Maiiya foundation.

## **Health Camps**

During the period we organised free health camps in rural and slum area of Jharkhand. It includes through fair check up by a doctor, distribution of free medicines along with specialist test namely B.P., Blood Sugar and haemoglobin (Hb) monitoring. These timely interventions provide early diagnostic and treatment.

Health, Hygiene's, open school system and skill up gradation were discussed with them. Mrs. Ragini Singh Asst. Director Janav was chief guest in the programme.

## **FFBH Responses to COVID- 19 Epidemics.**

While the entire world was in lockdown FFBH worked with migrant labour, single women and construction labour we distributed food, masks, sanitary napkins and Dried ration to them. We are providing and coordinating to source ration for families in local geographical area.

With support of postal department govt. of India also Sukha ration, oil, Safety kit was distributed among the people.

## **Safety kit distribution**

To help community members and garbage collectors, FFBH has distributed safety kits consisting of Reusable masks, Hand Sanitizers and soaps into different phase.

## **Children's Day**

On 14<sup>th</sup> Nov the FFBH celebrated children's Day because we believe in securing their dreams and aspirants, letting them achieve whatever their heart desires. During the session children got aware about child marriage, child abuse and what is good touch and bad touch we also had discussion on importance of education in achieving their dreams.

## **Human Right Day on 10<sup>th</sup> December**

We celebrated this day at Chiraundi Basti with 40 women's and adolescent girls its aim behind celebrating this day is to improve the physical, social, cultural and spiritual wellbeing and welfare of vulnerable groups of people. On this day we had discussion on human rights, so women can know about their rights. Many of the women were not aware about it. We also had detailed discussion regarding rape as most common crime against women in India. How can we make our girls fight against rape, what decisions should be taken for the victim.

## **Women's Day celebration**

Women's day celebration at Ranchi on 8<sup>th</sup> march. Approx 200 women's from different areas, SHGs Groups, Communities participated. Programme was organized with support of Jan Shikshan Sansthan Ranchi, in its Campus.

The prominent speakers had delivered discourses on the gender based issues and violence and discriminations solution to overcome from health + hygiene problems. They have made aware on open school system and skill upgradation. Mrs. Ragini Singh. Asstt. Director, IGNOU was Chief guest in the programme.

### Women Empowerment

#### 1. Maternal and child health / sanitation / nutrition campaign

On 9<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2021 Foundation for Betterment of Humankind with support of Maaiya Social change front distributed Mother & Child. Sanitation and Protection kit (Maay-Hauwa Kit) among 70 women whose delivery was done at community health centre of Honhe block. In the kit (A set of napkin, Baby towel, Baby dress, Blanket, Baby oil, Baby soap and a mosquito net) was there.

To protect new born baby from Mosquito and protect from Malaria, baby mosquito was distributed.

For women sanitary napkin and mask (to protect from Covid-19 were distributed).

In this programme Dr. Sabri (C.H.C. in-charge), lady doctor Dr. Manila Dulari Tirkey, C.D.P.O. of Kanke block Mrs. Waheeda Khan, Jharkhand Food Commission member Dr. Ranjana Kumari, Nutrition expert Dr. C.K. Mishra and Social Engineer from Vikas Bharti Mr. Nikhilesh Maity was there.

The main points on which the women were made aware :

- Personal and community hygiene.
- Has to take care of new born baby and their protection.
- Nutrition for Pregnant / lactating mother and new born child.

- Govt. schemes I.C.D.S. and Pradhan Mantri Matri Vandana schemes.
- Sahiya was also oriented to take care of pregnant and lactating mother and counselling of their family.
- A nutritional pamphlet was distributed among them.
- Mrs. Bilkis Bano, Sahiya sathi Bachchan Devi & Lalita Devi also did discussion and shared good case story among the mother.
